Director's Note



These past three productions of Les Misérables have been stunning and unforgettable in their own ways. I want to include the Director's Notes from the past two because this one was built on the visions and lessons learned from them, mixed with the circumstances of today that have made this production the most unique production I have ever directed.

2012 Director's Note

Every play begins with a director's vision; what do we want our audiences to experience when they come and see our version of the Les Misérables. My vision first focused on the color red and all the intense emotions it represents: sacrifice, forgiveness, love. Then I focused on this quote from the novel by Victor Hugo:

"There is a point when the infamous and the unfortunate are associated and confused in a word, a mortal work, les miserables; whose fault is it? And then, when the fall is the furthest, is that not when charity should be the greatest?"

I combined red and this quote for my final vision: throughout the play you will see these moments of "les miserables" punctuated with a red cloth filled with intense emotions that will pass from one character to the next. I hope leaving our production you will be inspired in your moments of "les miserables" to show this great charity and to embrace the intense red emotions we are so blessed to feel: to sacrifice, to forgive, to love!

This is one of the most amazing directing experiences I have ever had! The cast entered auditions with a tangible energy I have never seen before. The production team, cast, crew, and orchestra met the challenges and intensity of this beloved musical with an optimistic ambition... and I believe they will exceed any expectation you had entering this theatre. Enjoy our experience of Les Misérables... we certainly won't forget it!

2016 Director's Note

"The supreme happiness of life is the conviction that we are loved; loved for ourselves, or rather in spite of ourselves." ~Victor Hugo, Les Misérables

Les Miserables teaches so many lessons in just 2 1/2 hours! For my vision, I used the quote above as our focus for this production. So many people yearn to be seen for who they really are in their most miserable moments. And when someone does truly see them and shows them charity, these are the moments of Les Misérables. In 2012, I used a beautiful red scarf to punctuate these moments. This production will also have its own red scarf being passed from character to character in moments that they are loved and shown this mercy. My wish for this cast has been that they will take this lesson of Les Misérables and try to see others with this same kind of love; truly love others for exactly who they are, or rather in spite of themselves.

Wow! What an amazing opportunity to discover this beautiful musical with another group of talented youth! It has been an amazing journey with a superb production team gently guiding the youth to their greatest potential. A special thanks to the cast, crew and orchestra; you are a gift to direct! I would like to thank my incredible family for playing so much with me in theatre; you are my greatest joy! And a very special thanks to Erin for seeing me as I need someone to see me; you are a wonderful partner in theatre and a true friend!

2020 Director's Note

I want to add to my past two Director's Notes just a bit more. I implemented both quotes this time and the red scarf because they are all too beautiful! As I studied Les Misérables this time, I was touched by how extremely relevant it was to our time! Please take time to look at the parallels of our day and June of 1832 (it's in this program); it is fascinating. But my favorite part was how the youth took my breath away again. If you doubt how wonderful our youth are, do a play with them! The cast, crew, and orchestra worked so hard: They stayed positive with all the changes and the crazy world around them, they came to rehearsals prepared and focused, they cheered, they forgave, they laughed, and they loved; they epitomized what Les Misérables means.

I will, without doubt, never forget this production. We are amateurs doing theatre without apologies for the origin of amateur is from latin, amare: to love. We do this because we love it. We hope you look past our little errors (we had a lot of learning curves!) and enjoy every moment of Les Misérables because if you are reading this, we made it to the end!

- These riots were sparked by the death of General Lamarque on June 1.

- On June 5, the students/protestors in Paris built barricades and declared the center of the city their own.

June 2020

- Our country (as of June 6) is experiencing a pandemic of COVID-19 killing 110,000 in the USA.
- By law, people may not gather in groups larger than 20.
- In June, Protestors and Rioters are in the streets demanding a revolution: the end of racial discrimination.
- These riots were sparked by the death of George Floyd on May 25.
- On June 8th, protestors in Seattle built barricades and declared the center of the city an autonomous zone (their own).

Alain Boublil (Original French Lyrics)



Alain Boublil is the author of the librettos and lyrics for the musicals La Révolution Française, Les Misérables, Miss Saigon, Martin Guerre, and The Pirate Queen , all in collaboration with Claude-Michel Schönberg, as well as Marguerite with music by Michel Legrand. He also co-produced the original cast albums of all his shows. He co-wrote the screenplay of the Golden Globe-winning and Oscar-nominated film, Les Misérables. He is the author/lyricist of Abbacadabra, a fairy tale musical including


ABBA classic songs, of the stage adaptation of the Demy/Legrand film, Les Demoiselles de Rochefort, as well as author of the musical play, Manhattan Parisienne, and the play, The Diary of Adam and Eve. He wrote a prizewinning French novel, Les dessous de soi.

His many awards include two Tonys, two Grammys, two Victoire de la Musique and a Molière Award for Les Misérables as well as an Evening Standard Drama Award for Miss Saigon, a Laurence Olivier Award for Martin Guerre and a New York Chapter Honors Grammy for his outstanding contribution to the creative community. Boublil and Schönberg's 40 plus year collaboration was celebrated in May 2016 at Carnegie Hall as honorees of the New York Pops' 33rd Birthday Gala. Boublil was recently appointed to the Board of Directors of the New York Pops. He lives in New York with his wife, singer, actress, director, Marie Zamora, and is the father of four sons.

Claude-Michel Schönberg

(Music)



Born in 1944 of Hungarian parents, Claude-Michel Schönberg began his career in France as a singer, writer and producer of pop songs. In collaboration with Alain Boublil he is the book co-writer and the composer of La Révolution Française, Les Misérables, Miss Saigon, Martin Guerre and The Pirate Queen. In 2008 his musical, Marguerite, in collaboration with Alain Boublil, Michel Legrand and Herbert Kretzmer opened at the Haymarket Theatre in London. Claude-Michel has supervised overseas productions and co-produced several international cast albums of his shows. In 2001 he composed his first ballet score, Wuthering Heights, which was created by the Northern Ballet in 2002. His ballet, Cleopatra, which opened in 2011, was his second

collaboration with David Nixon and his seventh complete score. In 2012 Claude-Michel co-wrote the screenplay and reconceived the music for the Les Misérables musical movie. His shows have won many awards over the years, most recently the WhatsonStage audience awards for Best West End Show and Best Musical Revival for the London production of Miss Saigon. Golden Globe winner, Oscar nominee and Grammy award winner for his outstanding contribution to the creative community, Mr. Schönberg and Alain Boublil were honoured at a New York Pops gala concert in Carnegie Hall celebrating their 40 year collaboration. Mr. Schönberg was appointed Visiting Professor of Contemporary Theatre at St. Catherine's College, Oxford University - a position funded by the Mackintosh Foundation - and is now an Emeritus Fellow. He is an Honorary Member of the Royal Academy of Music where he is a guest Professor. Mr. Schönberg married the English ballerina, Charlotte Talbot, in 2003. He is the father of one son and two daughters.

Herbert Kretzmer

(Lyrics)



Herbert Kretzmer was born in South Africa, where he began a career in journalism writing the commentary for a weekly cinema newsreel. He came to live in London in 1954, and has since pursued twin careers as newspaperman and songwriter. He was feature writer on The Daily Sketch and a profile writer on The Sunday Despatch. He joined The Daily Express in 1960 and later became its drama critic, a post he held for 18 years, covering about 3,000 first nights. From 1979 to 1987, he wrote television criticism for The Daily Mail, winning, in this capacity, two national press awards. As a lyric writer he wrote weekly songs for That Was The Week That Was and the later Ned

Sherrin television shows. He won an Ivor Novello Award for the Peter Sellers/Sophia Loren comedy song Goodness Gracious Me . Other award-winning songs include two written with, and for, Charles Aznavour: Yesterday When I Was Young and the chart-topping She. Herbert Kretzmer wrote the book and lyrics for the West End musical Our Man Crichton, which starred Kenneth More and Millicent Martin, and the lyrics for The Four Musketeers, which ran for over a year at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, starring Harry Secombe as D Artagnan. He also supplied the lyrics for the Anthony Newley musical film Can Heironymous Merkin Ever Forget Mercy Humppe and Find True Happiness? He was the co-lyricist for Kristina which he wrote with Björn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson (ABBA), premiered at Carnegie Hall, New York, in September 2009. Herbert Kretzmer's latest work is Marguerite, written with Michel Legrand, Alain Boublil and Claude-Michel Schönberg.
